RE: Statement of Compliance for RoHS and WEEE Directives of European Union

The European Union's request for compliance to the Restriction of Hazardous Substances (RoHS - Directive 2011/65/EU) went into effect June 08, 2011 and the Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment (WEEE - Directive 2012/19/EU) directives. went into effect July 04, 2012. The RoHS directive (2011/65/EU) restricts the level of use of Lead, Mercury, Cadmium, Hexavalent Chromium Polybrominated Biphenyls and Polybrominated Biphenyls Ethers in electronic products sold in countries that comprise the European Union. The WEEE directive (2012/19/EU) requires the collection of electrical and electronic products at the end of their serviceable life and to meet the targets for reuse, recycling and recovery of the components, materials, and substances.

Hansen Technologies Corporation has reviewed the complete line of electronic products for compliance with the RoHS and WEEE directives.

All Hansen products are compliant with the currently released RoHS and WEEE directives set forth by the European Union.

Hansen products are either exempt or listed under "Category 9: Monitoring and Control". Products in Category 9 will be reviewed by the European Commission in the near future and likely will be added to the list of products that are required to be compliant.

Although Hansen products are either exempt or listed under Category 9, Hansen Technologies Corporation has made the decision to re-engineer the affected products to meet future RoHS directives for Europe and the new proposed hazardous substance standards in the USA and other countries. Hansen will continue to track any and all regulations at home and abroad and comply within stated deadlines.
